This system allows students to accumulate credits from various sources, including online courses, vocational training, and internships. Institutions are establishing mechanisms to assess and validate these credits, enabling learners to customize their academic paths and ensuring a seamless transfer of credits between institutions. The college places significant emphasis on creating awareness among students about the importance of their ABC ID. Through the ABC, students can access their unique ABC ID to track their credit earnings and accumulation from various Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) courses and Value Added Courses they undertake. This system enables students to have a comprehensive view of their academic progress and credit achievements. As per the circular issued by Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded, affiliated colleges have been instructed to register admitted students for the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC). The university has been actively raising awareness among faculty members about the significance and utilization of the ABC through various communication channels. Following the guidelines, the Principal and the Academic Incharge have instructed the faculty members to ensure the enrollment of admitted students in the Academic Bank of Credits. As of now, more than 96% of the</p>

	students have been successfully registered for ABC IDs.

Specifically, we dedicate a comprehensive subject branch called 'Pharmacognosy' to the study of Indian traditional systems of medicine, including Ayurveda, Siddha, Unani, and folklore medicine. This subject branch encompasses all aspects of Indian traditional knowledge within the pharmacy program.</p>
<p>5. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):</p>	<p>Institutions are aligning their curriculum and pedagogical approaches with the principles of outcome-based education. They clearly define specific learning outcomes for each program and course. By designing assessments that measure the attainment of these outcomes, institutions are fostering a student-centric approach that emphasizes critical thinking, problem-solving, communication skills, and creativity. This shift ensures that education focuses on the practical application of knowledge. POs of Pharmacy Programs are identified at the national level by the concerned accrediting agency. However, the evaluation of the attainment of these POs and COs is carried out by the college. To ensure alignment between COs and POs, a desired CO-PO mapping is conducted during the academic planning phase. This mapping is calculated on a scale of 1-3. At the end of each semester, the staff submits the course files along with the CO-PO mapping to the academic Incharge for evaluation. The college uses a formula to calculate the average Programme Outcome attainment. Shivlingeshwar College of Pharmacy, Almala has implemented the Outcome-Based Education (OBE) model of teaching-learning. The CO statements are defined based on the university's course structure, considering each topic or module of a course. The focus is on promoting higher order thinking skills such as analyzing, evaluating, and creating, rather than mere memorization of facts as in conventional education. The course outcomes are designed in accordance with these principles and are developed by the course in-charge in consultation with the Head of the Department (HOD). The equivalence between COs and POs is established through mapping using equivalence levels. The college ensures that students, faculty, and other stakeholders such as alumni,</p>

	<p>parents, and industry partners are aware of these COs and POs through display on the institute's website. Additionally, each subject teacher informs students about the respective course outcomes before the commencement of subject delivery.</p>
6. Distance education/online education:	<p>Recognizing the importance of distance education and online learning, institutions are strengthening their technological infrastructure and incorporating robust learning management systems. They are developing high-quality online courses with interactive content, fostering virtual classrooms that facilitate student engagement and interaction. As Pharmacy is a professional healthcare program, distance education is generally not recommended. Students are encouraged to pursue online courses through platforms like SWAYAM-NPTEL and other MOOCs (Massive Open Online Courses) that integrate the Indian knowledge system, art, culture, history, and languages. To facilitate online learning, the college is equipped with smart boards, projectors, and a quality sound system in the classrooms. Students are provided with computers for their use, and the IT facilities, including Wi-Fi, are regularly updated to ensure a seamless online learning experience. During the pandemic, the college utilized Google Classroom for conducting online lectures and other virtual events, enabling students to continue their education remotely. Additionally, the college regularly organizes various webinars to support regular education and provide additional learning opportunities for students.</p>

2.5 Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 Mechanism of internal/ external assessment is transparent and the grievance redressal system is time- bound and efficient

Response:

The Continuous Internal Assessment system at Shivlingeshwar College of Pharmacy adheres to the guidelines set by the Pharmacy Council of India and the affiliated university i.e; Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded. It encompasses regular assessments, transparent communication of examination-related information, and stringent invigilation measures to ensure fair and accurate evaluations.

This system encompasses two internal assessments for theory and practical in each semester for B. Pharm and M. Pharm courses. For Pharm D course, three internal assessments are conducted for both theory and practical.

To ensure the smooth administration of all internal examinations, the institute has a dedicated examination cell led by a senior faculty member. He is responsible for preparing, assigning, and coordinating all examination activities. The college academic calendar is prepared in consultation with the Principal and IQAC, aligning with the university's academic calendar for conducting internal assessments.

Transparent communication is prioritized, as all relevant information regarding the examinations, such as proposed dates, timetables, and mark lists, is regularly displayed on notice boards. The subject teachers confidentially submit question papers, mapped with course outcomes, to the examination and evaluation department, following the syllabus incorporated in the teaching plan.

Supervision schedules are prepared by examination and evaluation department, ensuring one or two invigilators are appointed per block according to student strength. Examinations are conducted under strict invigilation to prevent any malpractice. Students are instructed about the timelines and duration of the examination, and both the examination and evaluation department and examination committees remain vigilant to avoid any misconduct.

After the examination, answer sheets are submitted to the examination and evaluation department, and the respective subject teachers are directed to evaluate them within the stipulated time. The methodology for measurement of attainment of each program outcomes is assessed by Direct & Indirect Methods.

Direct method:

Provision of direct assessment is done through marks obtained by students in the semester which includes sessional examinations conducted by college and end semester examination conducted by Swami Ramanand Teerth University, Nanded.

The abilities to be developed in students as per course outcomes are evaluated in terms of results of internal and end semester examinations. For B. Pharmacy and M. Pharmacy Program two internal sessional exams conducted for theory subjects and average marks of two Sessional exams computed for internal assessment. Sessional exam conducted for 30 marks for theory subjects and shall be computed for 15 marks. Affiliated University conducts end semester examination for 75 marks.

For Pharm D. Program, three internal sessional exams conducted for 30 marks and average marks of best of two Sessional exams computed for internal assessment. Affiliated University conducts annual examination for 70 marks.

Institute follows the strategy to validate Outcome Based Education through various assessment components as described below:

Stage 1

Course Outcomes are defined by respective subject Incharge and approved from IQAC of institute. Course

Outcomes (COs) are mapped with the respective Programme Outcomes (POs). The mean value of mapping indicates how COs are related with POs.

Stage 2

The COs are validated with POs through examination system. The COs reflect different cognitive levels of each course. It is done on the basis of revised Bloom's Taxonomy. The student's learning abilities are assessed through various assessment components.

To calculate the examination attainment levels of the courses, faculty fixes target value with respect to each CO for both internal and end semester examinations. Later, the examination attainment of COs is calculated by considering the sum of all the students above the target level to the total number of students appearing for the examination.

CO attainment formula:

$$\text{Course Attainment (\%)} = \text{No. of students above target level} / \text{Total No. of students.}$$

These attainment values are then converted into attainment levels with respect to the correlation level.

Stage 3

The attainment of POs is calculated by considering the level of attainment of each COs as the multiplying factor by using the following formula:

$$\text{PO attainment} = \text{Mean weightage of PO} \times \text{Course Attainment Level}$$

Indirect assessment:

Indirect assessment of learning outcomes is a qualitative method where a student is assessed against certain assessment parameters that include components of COs and POs. The qualitative responses of students can be converted into quantitative grades or numbers to compute the attainment values.

In order to assess the program outcomes, indirect assessment is done through various activities like extracurricular, co-curricular, field visits, industrial trainings, student's feedback and student satisfaction survey.

Program outcomes like Leadership Skills, Life-long Learning, Environmental Sustainability can be achieved by the students through participating in various cultural and scientific programs.

The Library of SCOP is located on first floor of building with a total area measuring 154 sq. and equipped with student area, staff reading area, stacks, e-Resources and circulation and dispensing area.

Library has various parts like property counter, Circulation Counter, Journal section, Reading Hall, E-Resource access with internet facility and Reprography & Scanning machine.

The library is enriched with more than 11262 library collection and subscription to various print journals

and magazines annually. It also holds UG and PG research theses in its collection either as soft or hard copy.

Library collection is organized subject wise with books on Pharmacy and allied subjects recently.

We also have subscription SOUL 2.0 version software. Library is fully automated 2019. The library assumes a critical part in bestowing education. It is the resource hub for knowledge and has a vast collection of books, journals, magazines, periodicals. Library has facilities such as SOUL 2.0 software and OPAC computerized system, which facilitates students and staff. This helps them to get the correct book when required through book bank facility every student.

Separate reading room is available for students and teachers. Library has a collection of official compendia viz., Indian Pharmacopoeia, British Pharmacopoeia, United States Pharmacopoeia, Merck Index, Medical Dictionary, Martindale etc. The library gives facilities for self-study, research information collection and assemblage. All books are bar coded and a reference ID is given. The issues and returns are also digitized. Library has totally 11287 book volumes with wide range of 1533 titles.

The library has 27 Printed Journals and 27 e-journals. A computer workstation is available to faculty, research scholars and students to provide online and Internet services. The library is also a club member of National Digital Library since 2016 also owns electronic resources subscribed with DLNET.

The reading room is well furnished and provides conducive environment for study to the students and remain open for 24/7. Before availing the library facilities, the faculty and students needs to sign in the register at the entrance. Security of resources is ensured through a system of checking at the exit point for all resources borrowed by the users. CCTV cameras are also fixed in the library for strict surveillance.

Apart from this library houses more than 200 books on competitive examinations and literature.

A qualified librarian has been appointed to run library efficiently of library. Library provides open access to all the students. Students can issue two books throughout week on working days.

The library plays a crucial role in providing education and knowledge resources to students. With a wide range of books, journals, and electronic resources, the library facilitates self-study, research, and information gathering. It is fully automated, equipped with SOUL 2.0 software and OPAC computerized system. The library offers a conducive environment for study, operates 24/7, and ensures resource security through monitoring and CCTV surveillance. A qualified librarian manages the library, which provides open access to students.
